
History - Extract from 1960 Show Book

History of Rumball Hall

Rumball Hall is named after local businessman Bob Rumball. Rumball was commissioned by the 'Panel of Sporting Bodies & Associated Bodies' to deliver a report on all matters in connection with the reserves. This report became the blueprint of all future developments - the first purpose built Preschool - Natalie Gorey Preschool (now the Senior Citizens Club), and the Children's Social Club, which is now the Alice Springs Youth Centre.

Rumball made another suggestion: "There is sufficient development in the town and district for a local show which, besides encouraging local industry of all kinds, both household and commercial, could be made to cover school exhibits.

"One of the essentials of such a show is a suitable building, the report continued".

Rumball's suggestion for a local show was made two years in advance of the first Royal Darwin Show in 1952 but it was to be another decade before his idea came to fruition in Alice Springs.

- In classes of collections, exhibitors must supply their own equipment, bowls or plates for display. Artistic arrangements as well as quality will be considered when judging.
- Fruit and vegetables will be judged from the home garden angle rather that from a commercial agricultural or fruit growing angle.
- · Citrus fruit should have the stalks removed, with only the 'star' remaining.
- · Eggs shall be displayed in egg cartons.
- Farm Produce collection must consist of vegetables, fruit, eggs & dairy product





Interested in the CASS since its inception in 1960, Bill served as a council member for 25 years and Chief Cattle Steward for 12 years. He was Vice President from 1985-89, President from 1991-93 and was elected Patron in 1995. Through Bill's work and interests, he became involved with other organisations


concerned with the land. After all these years of meritorious service, Bill's work was recognised when he was awarded Centralian of the Year in 1989.

Clive Brooks Pavilion



- All Interstate Livestock arriving at Blatherskite Park for the show must be accompanied by a National Health Certificate, be identified with an appropriate NLIS device and, a National Vendor Declaration (NVD).
- The NT Waybill, National Health certificate and National Vendor Declaration forms, must be presented to the steward on arrival or at the earliest time possible the next day. These forms need to be travelling with the livestock.
- In the event that the cattle are not being accompanied or transported by the owner, the owner must advise the CBBA steward of their nominated representative.
- The cattle steward will be responsible for the scanning of the RFID devises and notifying the NLIS
 database of the movement details.
- All livestock leaving the show grounds must have a NT waybill issued from the duty agent before
 departure. Blatherskite Park has its own waybill for this use kept in the CBBA secretary office.
- All due care will be taken by the CBBA and its duty agents for handling of the cattle whilst at the
 park. If deemed necessary the CBBA will call a vet on behalf of the livestock owner if they are
 uncontactable, and fees will be passed on to the owner.



The chief steward or judge may at any time disqualify or suspend a horse or rider who in their opinion is either unsafe / unsound, ill-behaved, or who does not comply with the steward's or judge's instructions. Please also ensure that you take care when passing through the car park and warm up areas. Parking in area adjacent to the dressage area is reserved for floats. Junior Riders are under 18 years at the time of entry.

Main Oval Notice

• Due to safety and insurance reasons, no spectators are permitted to be on the oval during the horse events. The oval is strictly for mounted competitors, a strapper leading a horse, judges and nominated stewards/helpers only. This includes the show jumping area, except when competitors are walking the course. No unsupervised children are to be on the oval at any time. This rule will be enforced. Riders entering and exiting the oval must do so at a walk and ensure that they do not enter any area where judging is taking place.

Measure

- Horses to be presented in bridle and bit for measuring. Where height is stipulated, the exhibit must
 be measured each year by a CASS or EA appointed measurer. EA Life Measurement certificates are
 no longer accepted. The judge of a class may request any exhibit be measured in the presence of the
 chief steward in charge of the arena.
- The height then decided upon by the chief steward shall be final. When measuring, an allowance of 3/8" is allowed for shoes. For any queries on measuring please contact the chief steward.

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



Greatorex Pavilion

Greatorex Pavilion (largest Pavilion) is named after Michael Walter Seaton Greatorex (Mick).

Keenly interested in the formation of CASS, Mick was unanimously elected Inaugural President of the first Alice Springs Show, held at Anzac Oval in April 1960. He was re-elected President the following year and was awarded Life Membership.

In 1988 the CASS named the newly enlarged commercial pavilion, the Greatorex Building, to honour Mick's dedicated service.

Everingham Pavilion

Everingham Pavilion (middle Pavilion) is named after Hon. Paul Everingham AO

He was the first Chief Minister of the Northern Territory, Chairman of Blatherskite Park and a keen supporter of the Show Society.

Paul helped develop Blatherskite Park for the Pony Club and then as Show Grounds, he supported the move from Traegar Park to Blatherskite Park.
