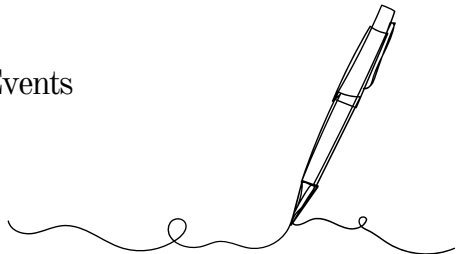

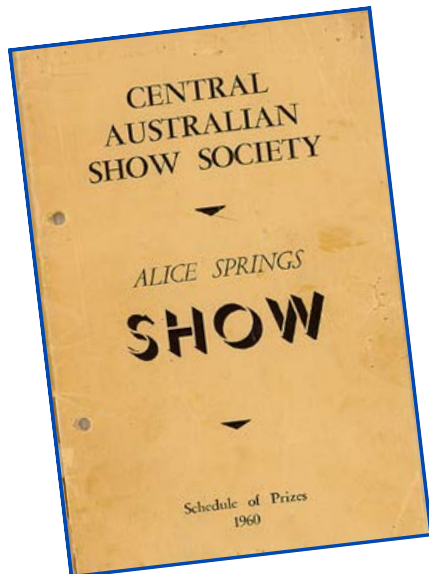
History - Extract from 1960 Show Book



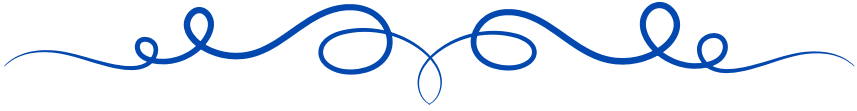

History of Rumball Hall

Rumball Hall is named after local businessman Bob Rumball. Rumball was commissioned by the 'Panel of Sporting Bodies & Associated Bodies' to deliver a report on all matters in connection with the reserves. This report became the blueprint of all future developments - the first purpose built Preschool - Natalie Gorey Preschool (now the Senior Citizens Club), and the Children's Social Club, which is now the Alice Springs Youth Centre.

Rumball made another suggestion: "There is sufficient development in the town and district for a local show which, besides encouraging local industry of all kinds, both household and commercial, could be made to cover school exhibits.

"One of the essentials of such a show is a suitable building, the report continued".

Rumball's suggestion for a local show was made two years in advance of the first Royal Darwin Show in 1952 but it was to be another decade before his idea came to fruition in Alice Springs.

Rumball Hall is currently home to all our wonderful competition entries including Agriculture, Art, Cooking, Craft, Hobbies, Horticulture and Photography

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- In classes of collections, exhibitors must supply their own equipment, bowls or plates for display. Artistic arrangements as well as quality will be considered when judging.
- Fruit and vegetables will be judged from the home garden angle rather than from a commercial agricultural or fruit growing angle.
- Citrus fruit should have the stalks removed, with only the 'star' remaining.
- Eggs shall be displayed in egg cartons.
- Farm Produce collection must consist of vegetables, fruit, eggs & dairy product
- Ensure that the correct number of items specified in each class are delivered, otherwise the entry will be disqualified.

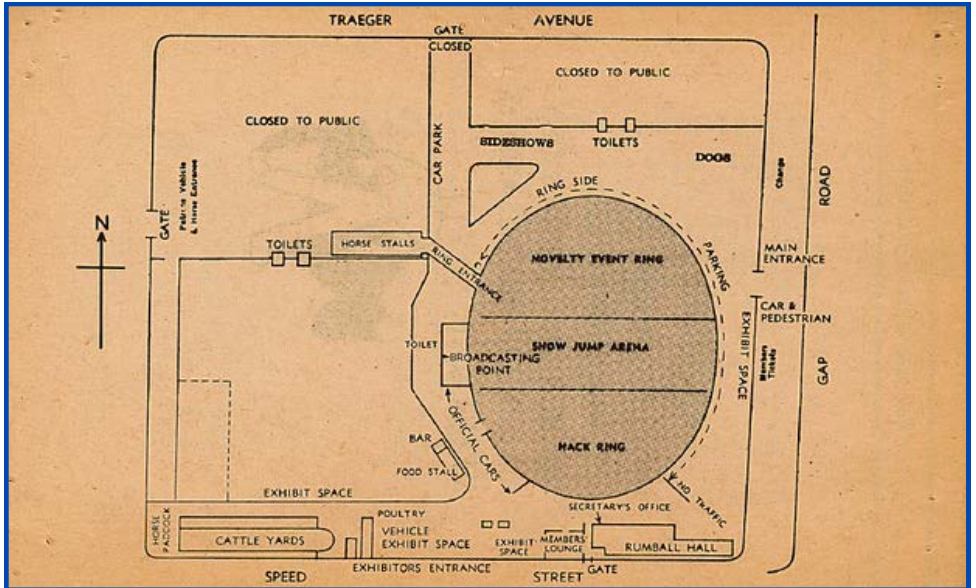

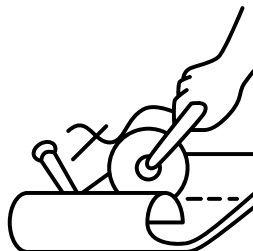

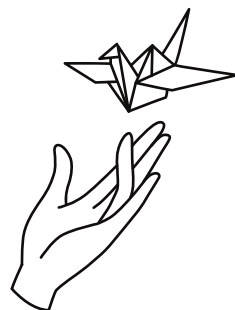

Definitions

- Wildlife: Photos depicting living, untamed animals in their habitat.
- Australian Wildlife: E.g. Kangaroos, emus, koalas. Photos of introduced and/or wildlife not unique to Australia are also accepted if the photo also highlights a uniquely Australian habitat.
- Flora & Fungi: Flora refers to all plant life - this includes trees, mosses, algae, flowers, seeds, etc. While fungi refer to mushrooms, yeasts and moulds.
- Twilight & Night: When the sun is below the horizon, after sunset and before sunrise.
- People: Candid photos or formal portraits of a person or multiple persons where the person(s) must be the primary subject.
- Scapes: Landscapes, waterscapes, cityscapes.
- Travel: Photos of uniquely foreign subjects; e.g. Architecture, vehicles, places, scapes, people.
- Central Australian Events: The Alice Springs Show, Finke Desert Race, Henley on Todd, Beanie Festival, etc.
- Central Australia: South of Three Ways (NT), north of Coober Pedy (SA), east of Warburton (WA) and west of Birdsville (QLD).
- Macro: Extreme close-up photos, usually of tiny subjects (e.g. Insects, flowers, seeds). Photos taken from further away with a telephoto lens are not macro photos.
- Creative/Experimental: Photos that display a novel effect because of an unusual combination of objects or an unusual viewpoint. Also, photos which have been modified during or after exposure (e.g. Digital manipulation).
- Open: Anything that does not fit in the other classes.

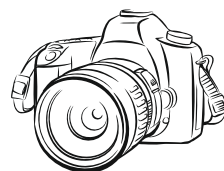

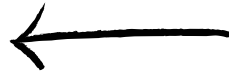

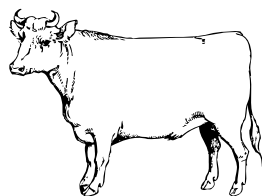

Bill Prior Yards

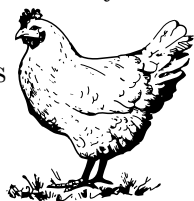
Thomas William (Bill) Prior, was a Past President and Patron of the Central Australian Show Society (CASS). Bill Prior transferred from the Quorn Branch of Goldsbrough Mort & Company, Stock & Station Agents, to the Alice Springs Branch in March 1948. Bill worked for Goldsbrough Mort until March 1957, then managed Hamilton Downs Station until he retired at the end of 1990. Interested in the CASS since its inception in 1960, Bill served as a council member for 25 years and Chief Cattle Steward for 12 years. He was Vice President from 1985-89, President from 1991-93 and was elected Patron in 1995. Through Bill's work and interests, he became involved with other organisations concerned with the land. After all these years of meritorious service, Bill's work was recognised when he was awarded Centralian of the Year in 1989.



Clive Brooks Pavilion

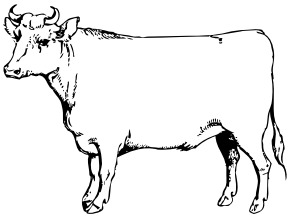

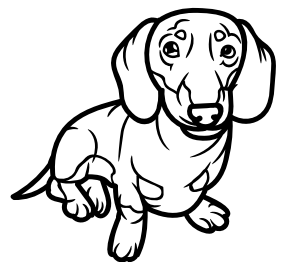
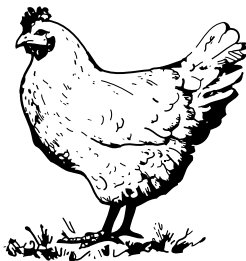

SPECIAL REGULATIONS

- All entries must be submitted online via www.alicespringsshow.com.au – You will receive an invoice for payment please ensure this is paid by 4pm Friday 28th June 2024. Late entries will not be accepted. Cattle must be placed under supervision of the steward BEFORE 4pm Wednesday 3rd July 2024. Please make sure that the PIC is supplied with your entry.
- To resolve a dispute cattle may be mouthed to determine dentition on non-stud cattle.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to check their entries with the steward before 4pm Wednesday, 3rd July 2024. All cattle are required to be ready for judging at the allocated time or they will face disqualification.
- Interstate cattle must be eligible for registration with the appropriate society.
- Cattle ARE NOT to be removed from the yards until Saturday 6th of July 2024, cattle removed will forfeit all cash prizes, trophies, and show results. All yards are to be left clean on the day of departure; this includes putting water bins away!
- Email CBBA Cattle secretary cattlesecretary.cbba@gmail.com for assistance nominating.
- All cattle are required to be ready for judging at allocated time or they may face disqualification.
- Interstate cattle must be eligible for registration with appropriate society.
- All yards are to be kept clean for the duration of the Show event and left clean on day of departure.
- Cattle in age specific classes are to be mouthed.
- Movement conditions:
 - All NT livestock arriving at Blatherskite Park for the Show must be accompanied by a NT Waybill be identified with an appropriate NLIS device and if being sold at the stud sale, National Vendor Declaration (NVD) and National Cattle Health Declarations forms.
 - All Interstate Livestock arriving at Blatherskite Park for the show must be accompanied by a National Health Certificate, be identified with an appropriate NLIS device and, a National Vendor Declaration (NVD).
 - The NT Waybill, National Health certificate and National Vendor Declaration forms, must be presented to the steward on arrival or at the earliest time possible the next day. These forms need to be travelling with the livestock.
 - In the event that the cattle are not being accompanied or transported by the owner, the owner must advise the CBBA steward of their nominated representative.
 - The cattle steward will be responsible for the scanning of the RFID devices and notifying the NLIS database of the movement details.
 - All livestock leaving the show grounds must have a NT waybill issued from the duty agent before departure. Blatherskite Park has its own waybill for this use kept in the CBBA secretary office.
 - All due care will be taken by the CBBA and its duty agents for handling of the cattle whilst at the park. If deemed necessary the CBBA will call a vet on behalf of the livestock owner if they are uncontactable, and fees will be passed on to the owner.

- **CLASSES E1 TO E28** – Led Section - All cattle must be Led and are open to all breeds.
- 1. Steward may request an exhibitor to release any animal not leading to a reasonable standard.
- 2. All led bulls showing more than temporary incisors are to be led with a halter and nose ring or clip.
- 3. 1st, 2nd and 3rd ribbons will be awarded in each individual class, provided by CASS.
- 4. 1st place winners of each breed and sex class section are eligible for Breed Champion judging, sash provided by CASS.
- 5. Breed Champions are eligible for Supreme Champion judging – sash provided by CASS.
- 6. Any class with large numbers of exhibitors may be split at the discretion of the steward.
- 7. Cattle entered in Classes E1-E28 (Led Section, excluding Classes EJ1 & EJ2) can be a single animal from a pen of 2 from the E29-E40 (Pen Section).
- 8. All cattle entering in the Grand Parade must be ready and assembled at the northern end of the Bill Prior yards on **Friday 5th of July by 2:25pm**. The cattle steward has the discretionary power to disallow any livestock from participating in the Grand Parade. Should an exhibitor have concerns regarding their beast in the Grand Parade they should notify the steward prior to the event; an exemption may be provided.
- **CLASSES E29 – E32 – Pen Section**
- Commercial and Interstate Bred Bulls.
- A maximum of 3 entries per class per exhibitor.
- Bulls must be off grain for a minimum of 8 weeks prior to the show.
- **CLASSES E29 to E40– Pen Section – NT & SA Border district bred**
- Only NT and SA Bred Border district cattle shall be eligible for entry.
- All cattle to be presented as a pen of two. Open to ALL breeds.
- Cattle to be available for commercial display Thursday, 4th July 2024, 3pm to 3:30pm for judging.
- Entries in Classes E35-E38 are eligible for the Centenary Cup Perpetual Trophy donated by CASS.
- 1st, 2nd, and 3rd ribbons will be awarded in each individual class, provided by CASS.
- Champions will be taken from the 1st place winners of each class (as outlined), sash provided by CASS.
- **SHOW BULL SALE** - Bulls Auction will be in the hands of the 2024 Duty Agents.
- 1. For Interstate Stud Bulls to be eligible for sale, two or less bulls must all be led. For over two head, one out of every three must be led.
- 2. Local Bulls must be exhibited in either a led or unled section of the show to be eligible for sale.
- 3. Interstate Commercial Bulls must be exhibited in either led or unled sections of the show to be eligible for sale.
- 4. Vendor declarations need to be with the duty agents prior to the Bull sale.

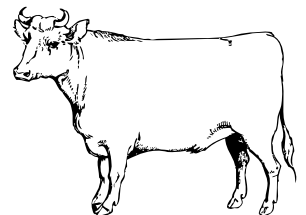

- Depending on number of entries, some Junior classes may be held prior to Show Days.
- Competitors must ride to the order of the draw or forfeit their entry.
- Timed draw will be available by contacting the above coordinators.
- Please advise the steward of any scratching, prior to start of competition.
- Riders must abide by dress and saddlery rules.
- Horses may only enter in two consecutive levels, e.g. Prep/Prelim.
- No late entries will be accepted.
- Tests may be called in accordance with EA rules.
- Riders wishing to ride HC must indicate this on the entry form.
- Only horse/rider combination competing may use the warmup areas during the dressage competition.
- No lunging in the warmup area is permitted.
- Any appeals must be submitted in writing to the chief steward within one hour of the event along with a \$50 fee. These will then be handed on to the board of appeals committee whose decision will be final.
- Warm up area is restricted to riders competing in the current or immediately upcoming event. This includes the warmup show jumps and the dressage area.
- Ill treatment of horses at any time on the Show Grounds shall result in disqualification from further competition. The chief steward or judge may at any time disqualify or suspend a horse or rider who in their opinion is either unsafe / unsound, ill-behaved, or who does not comply with the steward's or judge's instructions. Please also ensure that you take care when passing through the car park and warm up areas. Parking in area adjacent to the dressage area is reserved for floats. Junior Riders are under 18 years at the time of entry.

Main Oval Notice

- Due to safety and insurance reasons, no spectators are permitted to be on the oval during the horse events. The oval is strictly for mounted competitors, a strapper leading a horse, judges and nominated stewards/helpers only. This includes the show jumping area, except when competitors are walking the course. No unsupervised children are to be on the oval at any time. This rule will be enforced. Riders entering and exiting the oval must do so at a walk and ensure that they do not enter any area where judging is taking place.

Measure

- Horses to be presented in bridle and bit for measuring. Where height is stipulated, the exhibit must be measured each year by a CASS or EA appointed measurer. EA Life Measurement certificates are no longer accepted. The judge of a class may request any exhibit be measured in the presence of the chief steward in charge of the arena.
- The height then decided upon by the chief steward shall be final. When measuring, an allowance of 3/8" is allowed for shoes. For any queries on measuring please contact the chief steward.

- **Tests and Swabbing for Drugs**
- Tranquillising and/or stimulating is prohibited. The organising committee reserves the right to swab test under EA rules. If a horse is under treatment at the time of the Show, a veterinary certificate must be shown to the chief steward at the time of the horse's first event.
- CASS and any servant or appointee of CASS shall not be liable to an exhibitor for the death of or injury, damage or infection to any horse tested for drugs.
- **Veterinary Regulations**
- All horses from a tick infested area are to be treated and issued with a Waybill from Dept. Primary Industry and Fisheries, PO Box 8760, Alice Springs, NT, 0871. Ph: 08 8951 5211 before movement to the Alice Springs Show Grounds.

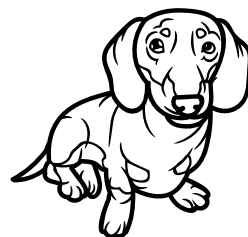

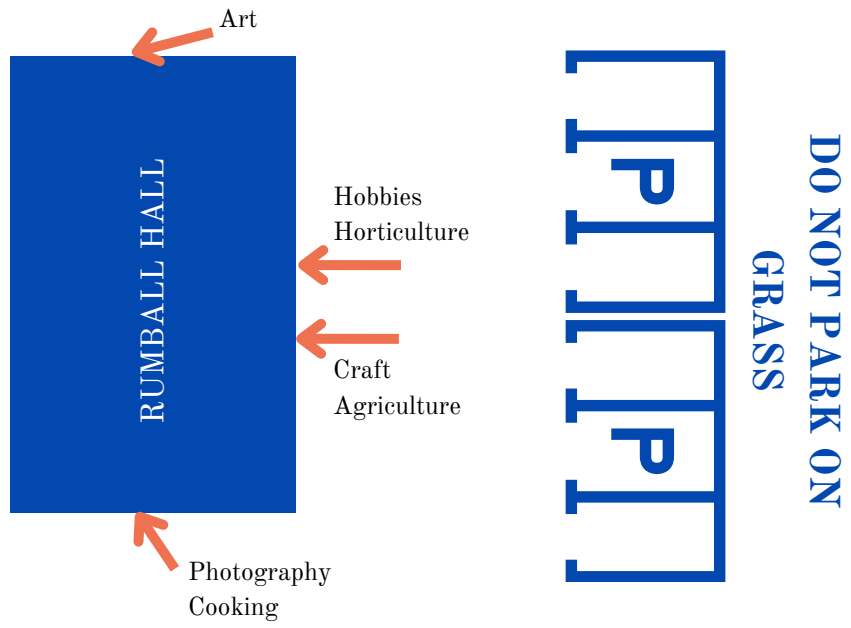

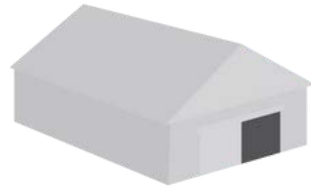

Greatorex Pavilion

Greatorex Pavilion (largest Pavilion) is named after Michael Walter Seaton Greatorex (Mick).

Keenly interested in the formation of CASS, Mick was unanimously elected Inaugural President of the first Alice Springs Show, held at Anzac Oval in April 1960. He was re-elected President the following year and was awarded Life Membership.

In 1988 the CASS named the newly enlarged commercial pavilion, the Greatorex Building, to honour Mick's dedicated service.



Everingham Pavilion

Everingham Pavilion (middle Pavilion) is named after Hon. Paul Everingham AO

He was the first Chief Minister of the Northern Territory, Chairman of Blatherskite Park and a keen supporter of the Show Society.

Paul helped develop Blatherskite Park for the Pony Club and then as Show Grounds, he supported the move from Traegar Park to Blatherskite Park.

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
