- In classes of collections, exhibitors must supply their own equipment, bowls or plates for display. Artistic arrangements as well as quality will be considered when judging.
- Fruit and vegetables will be judged from the home garden angle rather than from a commercial agricultural or fruit growing angle.
- Citrus fruit should have the stalks removed, with only the 'star' remaining.
- Eggs shall be displayed in egg cartons.
- Farm Produce collection must consist of vegetables, fruit, eggs & dairy product
- Ensure that the correct number of items specified in each class are delivered, otherwise the entry will be disqualified.

- No work may be entered in more than one class.
- The right is reserved for the steward and/ or judge to transfer any work to the correct class or section at their discretion.
- No article will be accepted for display only.
- Exhibits must be solely the work of the individual.
- All articles to be judged on workmanship 70%, style and suitability 20%, colour and materials 10%, unless otherwise stated.
- All exhibits must have some form of identification on them. Eg. Initials on pottery or wood; small cloth patch or tape with name attached (sewn unobtrusively) on fibre, fabric, knitting, quilts, etc. Exhibitor name to be printed on the back of framed works.
- To avoid confusion when dropping off and picking up of your entry, please give details of your article so that we can find it fast for you e.g. "a framed picture of a cow, with flowers" or "a quilt with butterflies on it and a floral design on the back of it."

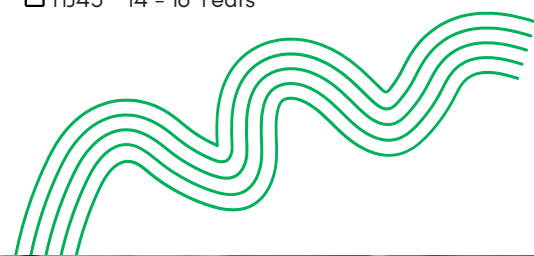

- The steward and/or judge reserves the right to transfer any exhibit to a more appropriate class or division.
- Collections must be a minimum of 10 items, no max limit but must be able to fit in the display cabinet.
- All exhibits must be marked with competitor's name, concealed where possible with reasonable allowances for other entries.
- The theme is 'Beyond the Gate'.
- No exhibits may be collected prior to the advertised times unless under exceptional circumstances where consultation with the steward will be necessary.
- All entries should not exceed the maximum of 40cm wide, 40cm long and 40cm high.
- Entries larger run the risk of not being accepted.
- Judging to commence Sunday after drop-offs.
- Any exhibit completed by two or more entrants must be entered in the group entry classes.
- Group entry classes are open to any project created by a team, and can be made from any hobby category within that age group. For example, group Lego project, a group recycled project etc. Group entries must still be inside the size requirements above.

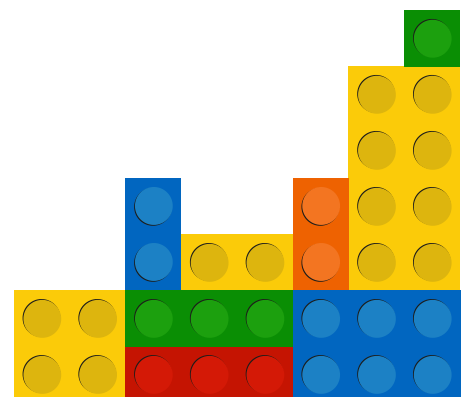

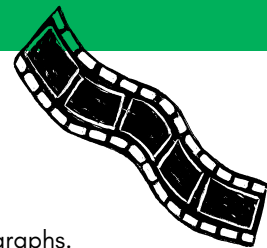

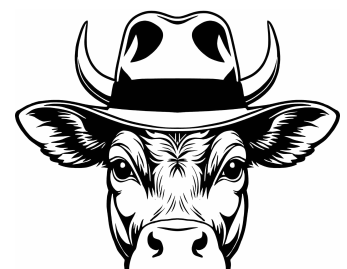

Show Challenge Recipe

- Sultana Cake -

- Melted butter, to grease
- 250g butter, softened
- 215g (1 cup) caster sugar
- 1 tsp vanilla essence
- 3 eggs
- 450g (3 cups) plain flour
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 125ml (1/2 cup) milk
- 385g (2 1/4 cups) sultanas

1. Preheat oven to 170°C. Brush a 9 x 19cm loaf pan with melted butter to lightly grease. Line the base and 2 opposite sides with non-stick baking paper.
2. Use an electric beater to beat the butter, sugar and vanilla essence in a medium bowl until pale and creamy. Add the eggs, 1 at a time, beating well after each addition until the mixture is combined.
3. Sift together the flour and baking powder. Fold half the flour mixture into the butter mixture and stir in half the milk. Repeat with remaining flour mixture and milk until well combined. Use a metal spoon to fold in sultanas.
4. Spoon cake mixture into prepared pan and smooth the surface. Bake in preheated oven for 1 1/2 hours or until a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Remove from oven. Set aside in the pan for 5 minutes before turning onto a wire rack to cool



Show Challenge Recipe

-Australian Bush Spiced Tomato Chutney-

- 1 kg firm red tomatoes, peeled, deseeded and chopped
- 3 Tbsp. oil
- 2 large onions, roughly chopped
- 1/2 head garlic, peeled and chopped
- 2 red capsicum, deseeded and chopped
- 125g rapadura sugar (use brown or raw sugar as a substitute)
- 250mls of red wine vinegar
- 2 dessertspoons of bush tomatoes, ground in a spice grinder or mortar and pestle
- 1 - 2 tsp. pepper berries, ground



1. Heat oil in a large saucepan over medium heat and cook onions, garlic and capsicum for 5 minutes or until softened.
 2. Add tomatoes and cook for 15 minutes to soften.
 3. Add sugar and vinegar and stir until sugar has dissolved. Bring to the boil and simmer for 25 - 30 minutes, stirring frequently, until most of the liquid has evaporated and the mixture is thick.
 4. Stir in the bush tomato and pepper berries (add pepper berries through a sieve) and cook for a further 5 minutes.
 5. Spoon into hot, sterilized jars and seal well.
 6. Process in a water bath
- *Make 1 month prior to allow flavours to mellow & develop

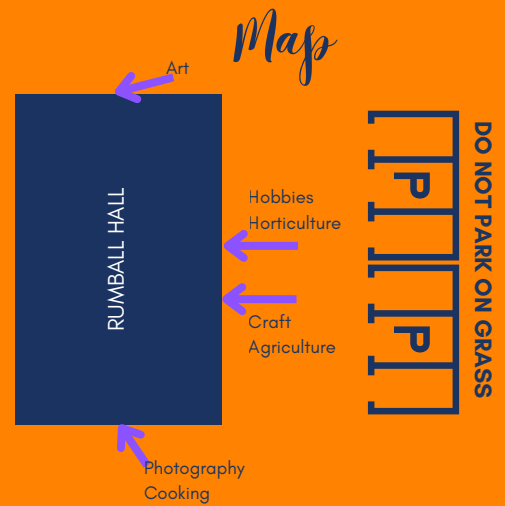

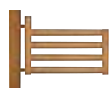
