Firstly I extend my thanks to the many volunteers, sponsors, committee members, stewards, friends and staff for their continued support throughout the last Show year. It has been a busy one we saw over 700 volunteer hours given by over 74 community members,

We celebrated 65 years of the Central Australian Show Society, we marked this occasion by including "something blue" in to our show categories, which was well received with over 3700 entries! During our celebrations we recognised 10 years of service to Holly Russell, who has for the past 10 years been an integral part of CASS. I would particularly like to thank Sue Ride for opening the 2024 Alice Springs Show, it was fantastic to have her open the show, but also provide patrons with why she loves the show and what the show means to her.

Our July Show was a resounding success, with over 20,800 patrons through the gates. I received a lot of positive feedback from the community and continue to still now receive feedback that it was one of the best shows. When you reflect on what we might have done different it is always hard to pin point exactly what was different about this show to the last. There were 9 free entertainment options for patrons to enjoy at the Show these included the Aussie Outback Woodchoppers, Bubble Tonic, Eesha Elephant,

Sandology and the Amazing Drumming Monkeys this came in at over \$100,000.00 in free entertainment included with your Show Entry.

2024 was out last year of our three-year Community Benefit Grant which we acquitted in October. This grant has for the last 3 years gone towards out our Tender Programs, we thank the CBF for their support of the Show and we look forward to continuing to be able to apply for grants through this program. The current priorities for the CBF are assets that will benefit the community beyond funding. We are currently working towards quotes for Mobile Light Towers and hopefully we will be able to apply for funding for 4 of these.

For the 2023 – 2024 Financial year that ended on 31st July 2024 the Central Australian Show Society reported an operating deficit of \$25,022.00 down from \$44,932 in the 2022 – 2023 financial year. The full audited financial reports are available to all members.

As most of you are aware Holly Russell departed from CASS in October, and firstly I would like to say thank you to Holly once again, for her dedication to CASS and our amazing events.

As we move forward the Event Manager role will be advertised after the AGM and we will look to hold interviews and fill this position by the start of February 2025. A big thank you to Rachael Mashford for stepping up and taking on extra work to ensure the Christmas Show went off smoothly.

There is so much that happens behind the scenes, we have recently been working with an external governance advisor to update our policies and procedures some of which are non-existent, and I would like to thank Rach Jericho and Glenn Marshall for providing feedback around these new fleet of documents and hope to have them ready soon in draft format for committee to read over.

2024 Admin report – Prepared and read by Rachael Mashford, Admin and Projects.

The 2024 Alice Springs Show marked the 65th anniversary of the Central Australian Show Society (CASS), and the event was widely praised for its enjoyable and relaxed atmosphere. We extend our sincere gratitude to the dedicated members of the CASS Council, as well as our sponsors and volunteers, for their invaluable contributions to making this event a resounding success. Overall, both Shows were highly successful, with most traders reporting a positive experience. The warm weather was appreciated by attendees, and both individuals and families enjoyed the festivities.

2023 Christmas Show

The 2023 Christmas Show took place in November. Due to the forecast of a storm, a decision was made two days in advance to relocate the event indoors to the pavilions. A few traders, who required gas supplies, remained outside. Many traders and attendees appreciated the indoor setup, which provided a more traditional Show atmosphere. The event concluded just as the final Duck Cup race took place, followed by a powerful thunderstorm.

CASS offered a variety of free activities for attendees, including:

This partnership was greatly enhanced by the many volunteers from The Butterfly Connection, whose support in selling raffle tickets alleviated the workload for CASS volunteers.

We also extend our heartfelt thanks to the local businesses that generously donated items for the Giant Stocking and to former committee member Janet Chisholm, who organized many of these donations.

The Christmas Show was well attended and continues to grow in popularity, becoming a favorite among both traders and attendees alike.
