

- In classes of collections, exhibitors must supply their own equipment, bowls or plates for display. Artistic arrangements as well as quality will be considered when judging.
- Fruit and vegetables will be judged from the home garden angle rather that from a commercial agricultural or fruit growing angle.
- Citrus fruit should have the stalks removed, with only the 'star' remaining.
- Eggs shall be displayed in egg cartons.
- Farm Produce collection must consist of vegetables, fruit, eggs & dairy product
- Ensure that the correct number of items specified in each class are delivered, otherwise the entry will be disqualified.

- No individual entry to exceed 50cm in any of its dimensions.
- Senior entries may be framed or mounted but must have appropriate hanging attachments (eg Wire)
- Junior entries cannot be framed due to display space.
- Juniors are restricted to one entry per person per class.
- Late entries will not be judged, and may be displayed only if space permits.
- Competitor's name & class of entry must be clearly printed on the back of each piece of art. Age of entrant as at the 30 June 2025 MUST be given for juniors.
- The Steward and/ or judge reserves the right to transfer any exhibit to a more appropriate class or division.
- All drawings and paintings must be unframed on thin card for hanging to protect from pins.
- Maximum size for Group entries is 2m wide and 1m high.

- The right is reserved for the steward or judge to transfer any work to the correct class or section at their discretion.
- No article will be accepted for display only.
- Exhibits must be solely the work of the individual
- All articles to be judged on workmanship 70%, style and suitability 20%, colour and materials 10%, unless otherwise stated.
- All exhibits must have some form of identification on them. Eg. Initials on pottery or wood; small cloth patch or tape
 with name attached (sewn unobtrusively) on fibre, fabric, knitting, quilts, etc. And name printed on the back of framed
 works.
- To avoid confusion when dropping off and picking up of your entry, please give details of your article so that we can find it fast for you e.g. "a framed picture of a cow, with flowers" or "a quilt with butterflies on it and a floral design on the back of it."





Animal Welfare

Competitors and participants at any event run by CASS have a responsibility to ensure the welfare of their animals and at all times to treat their animals humanely and with dignity, respect and compassion. Competitors and participants are to conduct themselves in a professional manner and act with integrity in all dealings. All competition events must comply with the Animal Welfare standards of their governing body.



- Exhibitors may enter two exhibits per class.
- The steward and/or judge reserves the right to transfer any exhibit to a more appropriate class or division.
- Collections must be a minimum of 10 items, no max limit but must be able to fit in the display cabinet.
- All exhibits must be marked with competitor's name, concealed where possible.
- Green Themed means all green
- No exhibits may be collected prior to the advertised times unless under exceptional circumstances where consultation with the steward will be necessary.
- All entries should not exceed the maximum of 40cm wide, 40cm long and 40cm high.
- Entries larger run the risk of not being accepted.
- Judging to commence Sunday after drop-offs.

Show Challenge Recipe

- Cinnamon Tea Cake -

180g cubed butter at room temp 3/4 cup caster sugar

1 tsp vanilla

2 eggs

11/4 cup self raising flour

1/4 cup plain flour

2 tsp cinnamon

1/2 cup milk



1 tbsp caster sugar (extra)
1 tsp cinnamon
1 tbsp melted butter

- 1. Preheat oven to 170. Grease & line a 20cm round cake pan with paper. Beat butter, sugar & vanilla until pale & creamy. Add the eggs one at a time beating well after each one.
- 2. Sift flours and cinnamon together. Fold in alternately with milk in 2 batches. Spoon into pan and smooth surface. Bake for 1 hour or until skewer comes out clean.
- 3. Cool in pan for 15 mins. Turn out onto rack. Mix extra sugar, cinnamon and melted butter together. Pour over cake and set aside to cool.
